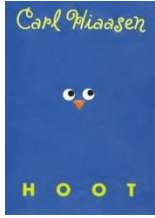


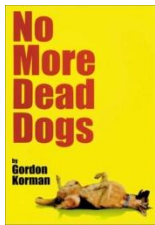

Hiaasen, Carl. Hoot.



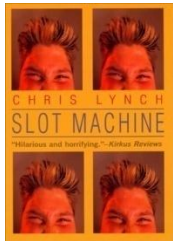
